## Our History In Education

Dziłth-Na-O-Dith-Hle Community School is located 25 miles south of Bloomfield, NM on the east side of Highway 550. The school was built in 1968 as a (BIA) Bureau of Indian Affairs operation, but in 2005 it converted to a grant school. Dziłth-Na-O-Dith-Hle Community School is a FACE – 8<sup>th</sup> grade school. The school is located in New Mexico on the eastern part of the Navajo Reservation near Huerfano Mountain, which is also one of the sacred mountains to the Navajo people. The school serves several chapters and communities.

Each year Dziłth-Na-O-Dith-Hle Community School enrolls between 150 - 180 students who are predominantly Navajo. The school population comes from the surrounding chapters; Huerfano, Nageezi, Counselor, Nenahnezad and Shiprock. Most of the students enrolled at Dziłth-Na-O-Dith-Hle Community School are from the area and their parents have the most interaction with the school. Parents serve on the (PAC) Parent Advisory Committee to support the school and they also participate in school functions.

Many of the students reside in the Residential Dormitory along with Bloomfield High School Students. Within the Dziłth-Na-O-Dith-Hle areas there is the school, staff housing, NHA housing, (IHS) Indian Health Services, a church, a Sheriff's Station and a Fire Station.

The school has the following departments: Academic, Facility, Transportation, Food Service, Business Office, Human Resources, Residential and FACE program.

The Academic Program is K-8<sup>th</sup> with self-contained classrooms from K-6<sup>th</sup> and specialized classes from 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade. Fine Arts classes include; Culture, Physical Education, Library, Art and Computer. Related services are provided to students within the Special Education Program.

The FACE program provides Home-Based and Center-Based Services to local parents and their children. The Home-Based program has Parent Educators who make home visits within the community to provide services to parents and their children from prenatal to 5 years old. The Center-Base is on-site and has a preschool teacher and a co-teacher who provide services to children from 3 years old – 5 years old. The Adult Education program is also a part of the Center-Based program that assists adults in obtaining their GED.
